

Department Operations

Although the Rich Creek Police Department is an independent police department, the Town is covered 24/7, as we operate alongside the Giles County Sheriff's Department, led by Sheriff W. Morgan Millirons. When both Rich Creek officers are off-duty, the Town is patrolled by The Giles County Sheriff's Department, along with the Virginia State Police. In addition, the towns of Rich Creek and Glen Lyn, Virginia have an inter-jurisdictional policing system, in which the Glen Lyn Chief of Police has jurisdiction in the Town of Rich Creek and vice-versa.

Personnel

The Rich Creek Police Department is one of only a handful of police departments in the Commonwealth of Virginia with only one full-time officer. We do however, have a part-time officer. Ron Worrell was previously the Chief of Police for Rich Creek from 2007 to 2008. He returned and filled a part-time position in April 2009. I'm very honored and thankful to have him here part-time, as he is a well-trained and very-knowledgeable officer.
